JOYCE PIPER, in whose memory this concert is dedicated, was a dilettante musician in the finest sense of the word; "a lover of the fine arts, a connoisseur." She studied piano all her life, and taught piano in her home for many years. The fundamentals of music, piano technique and perhaps most important, a love of music, were combined in her teaching.

Joyce was a dedicated member of the McDowell Club and the St. Cecilia Society in Flint. She was a devoted member of the hand bell choir at Court Street United Methodist Church. Many bells have been added to the bell collection at the church in her memory. Joyce loved nothing more than the joy of playing duo-piano with her friends and sharing that music with patients at local hospitals. In all her musical activities, Joyce's hope was to communicate her love of music to others, whether they be students, friends, or patients. And so it is appropriate that this concert, whose participants are primarily amateur lovers of music, be dedicated to one whose love of music was at the very center of her every day life.

THE CAROLYN M. MAWBY FUND



The CAROLYN M. MAWBY FUND was established at the Community Foundation of Greater Flint in 2000 by her friends and former students for the purpose of enriching choral music in Flint and the surrounding community. In the intervening years, with generous support from Bill Piper in memory of his wife, Joyce, the Carolyn Mawby Chorale has annually hosted the Flint Festival of Choirs, bringing a renowned choral conductor each year to work with our local singers and choirs and to present a concert for the public. Proceeds from these concerts have gone to the Carolyn M. Mawby Fund.

These Fund grants serve to continue Carolyn's influence in the musical life of the Flint community.

from the University of Western Ontario, a Bachelor of Arts and a Bachelor of Music Education from the University of Regina. She is also an Associate of the Toronto Royal Conservatory of Music (ARCT) in piano, voice, and flute.
